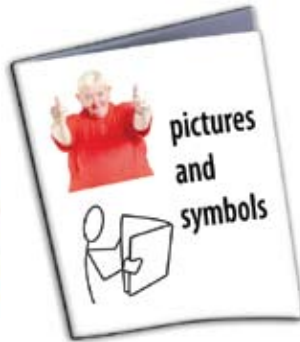


## The hospital communication book
